PRAYER TO END THE PANDEMIC

The Bishops of England and Wales are asking the Catholic community to sustain each other in prayer by joining a “shared moment of prayer each day at 6p.m.” Bishop Mark suggests praying the Angelus as 6p.m. is a traditional time for this prayer.

YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

Pope Francis declared the beginning of a Year of St. Joseph on December 8th. This was the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX declaring St. Joseph Patron of the whole Church. Bishop Mark asks all parishes in the diocese to seek St Joseph’s intercession most especially every Wednesday, the day normally dedicated to him, and on the 19th of each month. The following is the prayer to St Joseph, from the Apostolic letter, Patris Corde (“Heart of the Father”)

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer,

Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

To you God entrusted his only Son;

in you Mary placed her trust;

with you Christ became man.

Blessed Joseph, to us too,

show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life.

Obtain for us grace, mercy and courage,

and defend us from every evil. Amen.
