CATHOLIC CHILDREN’S SOCIETY PLYMOUTH – SLEEP ON THE FLOOR FOR A NIGHT

It may be hard to believe that in this day and age, there are children who do not have a warm and comfy bed to sleep in every night. In fact, one in five children living in the South West are living in poverty. As part of our Good Shepard programme, this Christmas CCSP is asking children living in the Diocese to think of those children less fortunate than them and give up their bed for one night to sleep on the floor. Both children and adults are asked to support this sponsored event.
